Pomona Majestic Theatre's Silent Movie

The silent film era wasn't very long, not really. It ran from the mid-1890s until the late 1920s, which isn't even 40 years. But when you think about it, "golden eras" of entertainment typically don't last for much longer than that, whether it's vaudeville, cable television or DVDs. On the basis of history, streaming will be subsumed by something else within a generation. Still, during that period an awful lot happened with silent movies. They went from flickering homemade images screened on sheets to a billion-dollar industry, with outposts in every developed country in the world, especially France, Germany and the US. Nothing beats giving one of these silent movies your full attention on a big screen with an audience, listening to music, getting information from visuals, appreciating the art of title writing. It's a different way of appreciating an art form – you have to adjust your senses a little – but it is rewarding. The Majestic Theatre transforms into a time capsule, screening silent films in an ambience reminiscent of early 20th-century cinema. Accompanied by a live organist who breathes life into each scene, these screenings are a must-see for film enthusiasts and history buffs alike, offering a rare opportunity to experience early cinema in its original form.

Come and join us on this great day out, starting at the Morayfield Shopping Centre bus stop at 9:00am. We'll travel to Pomona's Majestic Theatre by air-conditioned coach. The movie begins at 11am and runs for about 1 hr. Enjoy uninterrupted views on the Eco-Friendly Vessel as the boat makes its way through and past Lake Cooroibah towards the Noosa Everglades, (accessible only by boat) so that you can enjoy the peace and serenity of what only that part of the river allows. We will then cruise back towards Woods Bay, Weyba Creek, Noosa Sound Canals and the River Mouth.

The Noosa Region is an internationally recognised Biosphere Reserve, which exhibits amazing fauna and flora. Come along and see what makes it so special. Feel free to relax with your **BYO** snacks. Beverages will be available for purchase on board with complimentary tea and coffee.

The skipper will entertain you with their passion for the region, offering personal insights into the river's history, flora, and fauna. Glide close to nature reserves and view local wildlife, follow the curved sandbars of the river mouth and enjoy the relaxed atmosphere.

The boat leaves the jetty on Gympie Tce, Noosaville at 8:30am and returns to dock 3.5 hrs later at 12noon. After leaving the boat, lunch can be bought at the many restaurants or cafes at Noosaville, then we will hop back on the bus at between 1:30pm and 2pm to head back to Morayfield bus stop. **The boat only holds 38 people so get in quick to book your seat on this great day out.**
